### V. Minimum wage

Florida's minimum wage rose from \$7.93/hour to \$8.05/hour on 1/1/15, under a 2004 state constitutional amendment providing for annual indexation of the state's minimum wage. The same provision applies to the state's tipped (or sub-minimum) wage rate, which increased from \$4.91/hour to \$5.03/hour. More than half of all minimum wage or belowminimum wage workers in Florida are women.
