Minimum Wage

Connecticut's minimum wage rate is \$10.10/hour under a 2014 state law,⁸ and its tipped (or sub-minimum) wage rate varies from \$6.38-\$8.23/hour, depending on occupation. More than six in ten of all minimum wage or below-minimum wage workers in Connecticut are women.⁹
