## Minimum Wage

Florida's minimum wage rose from \$8.05/hour to \$8.10/hour on 1/1/17, under a 2004 state constitutional amendment providing for annual indexation of the state's minimum wage.<sup>8</sup> The same provision applies to the state's tipped (or sub-minimum) wage rate, which increased from \$5.03/hour to \$5.08/hour. More than half of all minimum wage or below-minimum wage workers in Florida are women.<sup>9</sup>
