Minimum Wage

Nevada's minimum wage rate is \$8.25/hour, or \$7.25/hour if the employer provides health benefits.⁸ Nevada has no tipped minimum wage exemption for employers and thus all hourly wage workers are covered by the state's regular minimum wage requirements. About half of all minimum wage or below-minimum wage workers in Nevada are women.⁹
